



THE LAIN RENNIE HOSPICE AT HOME


Iain Rennie Hospice at Home, 52A Western Road, Tring, Hertfordshire. HP23 4BB

In 1985 Iain Rennie was dying and his family wanted him to be cared for at home. Through a friendship between Iain's wife and a hospice trained nurse counsellor, five nurses decided to get together to provide the 24 hour nursing. cover that was needed for Iain as well as the care required to embrace and support his wife and young children. His company agreed to provide some funding to pay the nurses a basic wage and the nurses had the full support of Iain's GP and District Nurse. Iain's family believe strongly that the quality of the final weeks of his life was enhanced greatly by the fact that he was in his home environment where he felt safe and where the family played a considerable role in his care. By the time he died, a second patient had been referred to the group of nurses.

IRHH provides specialist palliative care for terminally ill patients in their own homes within the Chiltern area of Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire. Following referral by their GP or District Nurse, the "Hospice at Home" cares for patients of any age suffering from life-threatening illnesses. The primary aim of all Iain Rennie nurses is to provide a dignified and pain-free life for as long as possible.

Florence Nightingale House, the Aylesbury Hospice, was built in the late 1980's, as a result of a successful public appeal, which raised over £500,000.

The aim of the Aylesbury Hospice is to provide a first class palliative care service which is accessible to the people of Aylesbury and the surrounding area.

Running costs exceed £1 million per year, and

this year the Friends of Florence Nightingale House have pledged to provide £309,000 towards these costs.

The Friends contribute to the funding of the Children's Hospice at Home Care Team, the Lymphoedema Clinic, the Day Hospice, the Volunteer Service and also towards the salaries of nurses who work in the In-Patient Unit.

All contributions, however small, are always much appreciated by everyone concerned.

The Hospice of St Francis,

The Hospice of St. Francis is an independent hospice aiming to provide the highest standard of care to people with advanced illness for whom cure is no longer possible. Specially qualified staff and volunteers work together to enable patients to live life as fully as possible and to meet death free from pain and fear.

The Hospice has eight in-patient beds facilitating over

200 admissions per year with a median length of stay of 7 days and a discharge rate of 50%. Patients are admitted for a variety of reasons including palliative treatments for transfusion, Pamidronate infusion, lymphoedema treatment or paracentesis, rehabilitation after major cancer surgery, respite care (one bed reserved for regular respite) and terminal care. Complementary services include Continuing Care Sisters who work in a Macmillan style assessing and supporting patients at home (90 new cases each year); Day Hospice providing 16 places per week (over 500 attendances last year); and a comprehensive bereavement service including telephone helpline, visiting service and support groups. St Francis also provides monthly study days for local nursing and residential homes.

Notes for you to take home on colour, style and image

We were determined to make this an enjoyable but not exhausting evening for you! As a consequence we have given over much of the evening to the fashion show and kept the lectures about colour and style to a minimum! Therefore here is some information to back up some of the short demos you will see.

COLOUR ANALYSIS:

You will get a very short talk about the two systems but here they are again to remind you of the main points:-

Seasonal

Winter = Cool, dark, bright (primary colours or very "icy" "White with a hint of" colours Typical example = Victoria Beckham (with natural hair!) Catherine Zeta-Jones, Nigella Lawson Summer = Cool, muted/smoky, light ("bed of sweet peas") colours

Typical Examples: Sophie, Countess of Wessex, HRM The Queen, Emma Bunton Autumn: Warm, dark, muted (the colours of Autumn, russets, sages, olives, browns)

Examples: Amanda Burton, Sarah Duchess of York

Spring: Warm, light and bright (fresh greens, corals, golden brown

Tonal:

Looks at the actual colour. Is it warm or cool? Is it light or dark? Is it bright/vivid or muted/dull/smoky? These are the first pointers, then we look at intensity. How saturated is the colour? Think of the difference between a rich cherry and a watery watermelon.

Whatever system is used, the only successful way to analyse colours that are right for you is to be comprehensively draped in daylight conditions. Colour analysis usually takes about an hour to get a correct colours and tones. All we look for is the colours and tones which bring out your natural beauty.

IMAGE OR DRESSING FOR YOUR PERSONALITY

You've seen what happens to politicians and their partners by "Image consultants". Style and Image is really just a way of working out what works best for you, your personality, your lifestyle and your body shape. The object is, like the colours, to bring out the best in you as an individual.

Main "personalities"

"Romantic" - flowing, floral, feminine - eg Actress Jane Seymour. Designer: Laural Ashley

"Ingenue" - youthful version of romantic, often more petite in stature - Actress Jane Asher

"Classic" - smart, tailored, groomed, simple - Designer: Channel, Jean Muir range

"Dramatic" theatrical, makes an impact – Liz Hurley, Catherine Zeta Jones – Designer: Lacroix, Versace

"Natural" - sporty, casual Designer: Aquascutum, Burberry

"Gamin" - petite, elfin, perky version of natural - eg Actress Demi Moore

There are other categories which are a certain look which include bohemian, long skirts with flat boots and chunky cardigans, gypsy with flouncy patterned skirts, indian with layers of kaftans, grunge comes and goes but is basically whatever looks terrible all put together and the list goes on. If you have the character to be individual that's great! However the image guide above helps those of us who need assistance to feel right.

STYLE

The last element is to look at your body shape. Does it fit into triangle, heart, hourglass, straight, round, pear-shaped, apple-shaped? Also are you big medium or small in frame size? What shape is your face? (heart, diamond, square, round, oval) - knowing this could be the difference between a successful or unsuccessful hairstyle. Most women will tell you about their "bad" bits—"thunder" thighs, "fat" bottom, "huge" hips, "short" legs, "flat" chest. OK so none of us are perfect and we are all different. You have to learn how to disguise these elements because most of them you cannot change. What you can also do is draw attention to the parts of yourself that you do like. These are all part of a style and image course which usually lasts about a day.




